- The Dear Old Lake Memories of Crystal Lake and the Village of Gilmanton Iron Works by Elizabeth Widger Arms and other "First Family" members. 170 pages with illustrations. (\$20.00)
- Gilmanton: Evolution of a New Hampshire Hill Town from 1880 to 1940 by Pat Clarke, a time in which Gilmanton ceased to be a manufacturing town and saw a major decline in its agriculture and population. (\$15.00)
- Gilmanton Summers by Jane Cumming, records her recollections of summers in Gilmanton in the early 20th century. It is illustrated with photographs from the period. (\$15.00)



- Gilmanton, My Home Town Memoirs of Louise Place Shurbert. Illustrated with photos from the museum collection. (\$12.00)
- History of Gilmanton, NH to 1875 by William Badger, picks up where Lancaster left off. In addition to information on the industry and politics of the time, it includes information of genealogical interest. (\$10.00)

- Historic Postcards A selection of reproductions in full color issued prior to 1920. (\$1.00)






Explore the beauty of the Howe Conservation Area. Hike the *Urner Trail* to Meetinghouse


